New Residence Hall



NYCPM is proud to announce the addition of a new campus residence hall starting this fall for the Class of 2014. The residence hall, called *The Heritage*, is located on the corner of 5th Avenue and 110th Street, just steps away from the top of Central Park.

The Heritage consists of two hi-rise buildings that feature renovated kitchens, bathrooms, and flooring in each apartment. Some units also come with stainless steel appliances, custom designed solid wood cabinets, black granite countertops, contemporary bathrooms, and spectacular views of Central Park.

The units feature suite-style living with 3-5 bedrooms. Utilities (including internet) are all included, and all units come fully-furnished. The majority of units will be occupied by medical students from NYCPM, Mount Sinai, and Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine, creating a close-knit community of medical professionals.

Just a short walk away are things like the New York Sports Club, Mount Sinai Hospital, Lasker Ice Rink and Pool, the Conservatory Gardens, and Museum Mile (including such world-class museums as the Met and Guggenheim).

Transportation options abound, including a short 1-2 block walk to the 2, 3, and 6 trains which can get students to the College in less than 15 minutes.
