

Louis L. Levine President and CEO



Louis L. Levine has been President and Chief Executive Officer of the New York College of Podiatric Medicine and Foot Center of New York since 1991. He was Corporate Vice President for Governmental and Public Affairs at Empire Blue Cross-Blue Shield, one of New York's leading not-for-profit healthcare insurance organizations, from 1980 to 1991. In March 1976, he became Chairman of the Executive Committee and Deputy Chairman of the Board of Directors of Group Health, Incorporated, serving until 1979.

From 1966 to 1976, Mr. Levine served as Commissioner of Labor Affairs and as Industrial Commissioner of the State of New York under Governors Nelson Rockefeller, Malcolm Wilson and Hugh Carey. Mr. Levine also served his country for more than four decades, first in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and then in the U.S. Army Reserve, from which he retired in 1987 as a Lt. Colonel.

Mr. Levine holds a PhD degree (a.b.d.) in Sociology, as well as a Master of Arts degree in Industrial Sociology from New York University, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology and Psychology from The City College of The City University of New York. He has been awarded honorary doctoral degrees from Marist College, the New York College of Chiropractic Medicine, and the New York College of Podiatric Medicine.
