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In mid-October, Volume 27 of Podiatric Medical Review (PMR) 2018-2019 was published online. (An effort to get printed copies is underway.) Vol. 27 was edited by Sanjna Sanghvi, BS (Class of 2020), with Senior Editors Karla De La Mata, BS Mohammed Gheith, BA, (both 2020), eight peer reviewers, five faculty reviewers, and Faculty Advisor Anthony Iorio, DPM ('81), MPH. Jenna Friedman and Farah Naz (both 2021) are the current editors-in-chief for Volume 28. Ms. Friedman described PMR as a peer-reviewed journal that provides students with the opportunity to complete podiatric research as well as analyze existing literature about various podiatric-related topics. As a peer-reviewed journal, PMR allows students to not only write and contribute their own literary works, but also to become comfortable with the editing process. PMR's goal is to acclimate students to the research process from start to finish, and help to create well rounded future clinicians. Michael J. Trepal, DPM ('81), FACFAS, called the "pursuit of academic curiosity and contributions to the medical knowledge base a truly noble calling," adding that "the skill sets learned by those who participated will last a lifetime."
